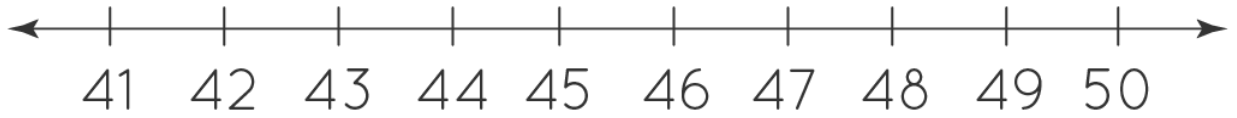

1. Do you know that when we add 0 to any number, the sum is the number itself? For example,  $8 + 0 = 8$ .
2. When 1 is added to any number, you get the next number, or the successor. For example,  $6 + 1 = 7$ .
3. The order in which you add a group of numbers doesn't matter, the answer is the same. For example,  $2 + 5 + 3 = 10$ ; and  $5 + 3 + 2 = 10$ .
