



FUN FACT

- 1. The symbol > is used for comparing numbers and values. The rule is that the wide-open side of the sign always faces the bigger number, whereas the closed end points towards the smaller number.
- 2. Have you heard about the alligator method? Imagine the symbols (< and >) to be the mouth of an alligator, and the numbers on each side as the little fish. Now, the alligator will always want to have a greater number of fish. For example, 6 > 3.
